Building Partnerships

Beulah Elementary School provides many opportunities that parents can utilize to help their children succeed. The **Parent Resource Center** (PRC) offers a variety of resources such as educational games, books, workbooks and other materials. The lending library provides parents with an opportunity to check-out resources for home use. There are also parent workshops and meetings scheduled throughout the year. Douglas County School System Goals

The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or Distinguished Learner on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts and Math End of Grade Assessments will increase by six percentage points.

Beulah Elementary School Goals

The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or Distinguished on STAR Reading and STAR Math will increase by six percentage points.

The fifth grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in reading and math. We will work with students and families in the following ways:

- ◆ Provide parents with MyOn and Classworks login information to improve their child's reading comprehension and fluency.
- ◆ Provide parents with iLearn and Xtramath login information and ways to practice basic math facts at home.
- ◆ Offer Family Nights throughout the year that focus on reading and math skills. Provide helpful tips during parent conferences.
- ◆ Provide parents with our monthly newsletter that offers activities and games to help review math and

AT HOME

Beulah Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key at-home activities will be:

- ◆ Read nightly with my child for 20 minutes and discuss what was read in order to increase comprehension. Utilize MyOn and Classworks programs at home.
- ◆ Practice basic math fact fluency nightly with my child using iLearn and xtramath.
- ◆ Attend Family Nights and parent conferences to attain helpful information.
- ◆ Utilize the activities and suggestions provided in the monthly newsletter to support the content learned within the classroom

BEULAH ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

Beulah Elementary School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in reading and math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- ◆ Read for a minimum of 20 minutes every day and practice reading comprehension skills using printed text, Classworks, and MyOn.

- ◆ Attend Family Nights with my family where I can practice and learn helpful tips for home.
- ◆ Play the activities and games in the monthly newsletter to support the content learned in class.
